Work on the Building — Trinity's existing boilers are in the midst of being replaced through a generous grant from the Trinity Foundation. The existing boilers are early 1990's vintage and endured a flood while they were located in the sub-basement portion of the building. The new replacement boilers are high efficient models with up to 98% Thermal Efficiency and will utilize PVC venting.

Robert Nickerson Receives Paul Harris Community Service Award — Robert D. Nickerson was one of four community leaders/volunteers who have made "significant contributions of their time, talents, and resources to our community" were recognized with the Paul Harris Community Service Awards at the Downtown Rotary meeting this week. In 1960, Nickerson helped to restore the Embassy's grand Page Organ, with the help of retired organ builder Al Buzby, and helped to save the Embassy from the wrecking ball in the 1970s, restoring the theatre. Nickerson has also been instrumental in restoring the theatre organ in Wagenhals Hall here at Trinity.

The Paul Harris Community Service Award builds on Rotary's motto of "Service Above Self." All recipients must be non-Rotarians and are nominated by members of the Rotary Club of Fort Wayne.
